## **Freedom of Information Request - Reference No: 20182033**

### **REQUEST**

Could you please tell me for the years 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 to date how many civil injunctions, Community Protection Notices (CPN), Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ACB), Criminal Behaviour Orders or Anti-Social Behaviour Orders (ASBO), while these were still in use, have been issued in Sheffield.

Could you please tell me the youngest and oldest recipient of each of these sanctions/agreements for the year in question.

If possible, could you break the figures for 2017 and 2018 down by the reason the sanction was imposed or the contract signed.

Finally, could you tell me on how many occasions the conditions were contravened, and what the outcome was in those cases.

### **RESPONSE**

Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires South Yorkshire Police, when refusing to provide such information (because the information is exempt), to provide you the applicant with a notice which:

- a. states that fact,
- b. specifies the exemption in question and
- c. states (if that would not otherwise be apparent) why the exemption applies.

The following exemption applies to the disclosure of the information:

#### **Section 12(2) – Exemption where cost of compliance exceeds appropriate limit**

We have been asked for data in relation to civil injunctions on a number of occasions before, which we regret we are unable to provide within the 18 hour cost threshold.

Information is held at district level within South Yorkshire Police. I have previously approached each of our Business Managers for Sheffield, Barnsley, Rotherham and Doncaster districts for assistance with requests of this nature. They have in turn contacted their Community Intervention and Anti Social Behaviour Teams. I can confirm that I have been advised that whilst we hold a lot of the information relating to your request, it would take in excess of 18 hours to locate, retrieve and extract the relevant information to answer it. For example, one district has returned and advised that they hold over 650 records of individuals on their database. In order to extract the information you have requested, it would be necessary to initially conduct a manual trawl through the 650+ records to identify those who have received Community Protection Notices as an example, and then access and review the related paper records to establish the exact circumstances. Assuming it would take approximately 5 minutes to review each record manually, it would take in excess of 54 hours to provide the information you have requested for CPNs alone.

The Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004 provide that the cost limit for non-central government public authorities is £450. This must be calculated at the rate of £25 per hour, providing an effective time limit of 18 hours. . If you feel your endeavours can be achieved within the appropriate limit by refining your request, South Yorkshire Police would be more than happy to consider any further request.

Guidance from the Information Commissioner to public authorities is that where one part of a request is reasonably estimated to exceed the appropriate limit then the authority is not obliged to consider or comply with the remainder of the request up to the point at which the appropriate limit has been reached.
